





#### 2015 WINTER BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING February 12, 2015 – Sky View Club in Kaukauna, WI

There were 8 members present when President Jim Sehloff called the meeting to order at 7:08 pm

A motion was made, seconded and approved to accept the Board Meeting minutes of November 6, 2014

Treasurer's Report was accepted as presented with updated report for meeting

The following reports were given: (\*via email)

#### NEWSLETTER EDIT OR REPORT (Steve Bieda)\*

No report at this time

#### WSLS REPORT (Rick Van Goethem)

- Over 40 people attended the PAC fundraiser on Thursday at the Institute and raised over \$1500
- The Institute had 988 participants attend
- Over 40 people attended the first "Young Surveyors Network" meeting
- Chapter Directors were asked to discuss with their chapters the possibility of combining WSLS and Chapter dues into one payment to WSLS
- Bruce Bowden, member of the Professional Land surveyors Section of DSPS, reported that there are currently 15 complaints, in various stages, in the system. He also reported that there will be 4 meetings per year for the Section, up from 2-3. DSPS also audited 94 license renewal applicants, with four being asked further questions. A-E 7 revisions were also discussed
- Next Board Meeting will be in Rothschild on March 14

#### NSPSREPORT (Lisa Van Horn)\*

 No report at this time. There is a detailed report in the latest WSLS Board meeting minutes

#### AUDITING (Anthony Lulloff/Brad Nelson)\*

2014 report was presented – everything is in order

#### CST (Aaron Ballast)

- There are currently 65 active CSTs in Wisconsin
- NWTC will be hosting a CST exam on April 1, 2015, with 10 students currently signed up

#### ETHICS AND PRACTICE (Tom Leslie)

- No requests or completed forms were received since the last meeting
- As earlier reported, there are now 4 meetings a year for the DSPS Land Surveyor Section

#### LAND RECORDS (Ryan Duckart)

- WLIA is hosting their annual conference at the KI Conventional Center in Green Bay February 18-20
- Brad Buechel has been appointed County Surveyor of Calumet County
- As of 1-1-2015, all of the remonumentation efforts have been completed in Kewaunee County. It should be noted that they stopped monumenting centers of section about half way through their remonumentation project due to a lack of consensus among surveyors about whether or not they would honor center of section locations set by the county. Tie sheets, township control summary sheets, plat of surveys, tax information with parcel mapping, and aerial mapping are all online for no charge. The contours were generated with a LIDAR flight and have 2' contours that have proven to be very accurate. You can search by name, address, or parcel number. To get CSM's scanned and sent to you via internet you will need a membership or an account with Janet Wolf from the Register of Deeds
- Fond Du Lac County has all Plats of Surveys, ALTA Surveys, Tract Indexes, Section Summaries and Tie Sheets available online, available for viewing/printing, no subscription or login required. They can be accessed by visiting the Fond du Lac County website-Departments-Surveyor- click on the links to plat of surveys. They are available for searching by section-town-range or by subdivision name. The entire subdivision name does not have to be spelled out. In searching section 1-9, the field must be typed in with two digits, (01) (02) ed. Subdivision name and searching sections 1-9 are the biggest problem users are having in searching. Users can contact Peter Kuen with any questions through the Fond du lac County website. Manitowoc County has had tile sheets, Plats of Surveys, and section summaries online now for about 1.5 years. Brown County is still working on adding surveys in the City of Green Bay to their online index. The rest of the county is complete with CSMs, Subdivisions, and Plats of Surveys
- Florence County does not have a full time County Surveyor so the Register of Deeds serves as the place where surveyors can do research and get information to aid in their work. However, there is some concern that very few surveys and maps are being filed at the county. It is required by state statute to file maps in the county that they are performed in within 60 days upon completion, so if anyone has any work that they


### Land Surveying in Ancient Times: Greece, Rome & Egypt

Although today land surveying often makes use of GPS, computer models, and other recent technical developments, the profession of surveying actually dates back centuries. Evidence of surveying techniques can be found throughout much of recorded history. In fact, land surveying principles date back nearly as far as the idea of land ownership. As soon as individuals or groups owned specified areas of land, there was a need to describe or delineate who owned what, particularly to solve land disputes. This is where land surveying came in, although of course today land surveying is utilized for many other purposes too.

Ancient Egyptian surveying activities were particularly modern for their time period. When the Nile River over-flowed its banks, washing out the existing boundaries between farms, these boundaries were re-established

through the use of simple geometrical concepts by a surveyor. In this time, surveyors were known as rope stretchers because the measuring device they used was a knotted rope.

Other examples of ancient Egyptian surveying prowess can be seen in the Great Pyramid of Giza. Built around 2700 BC, the pyramid exhibits nearly perfect squareness and a north-south orientation. Despite its massive size, its orientation and squareness are each off by only a matter of inches. The



Egyptian land register, created around 3000 BC, is the first known land ownership record. This record showed the owners of various areas of land and also recorded the locations of this land. Surveys such as those used to create the land register were based on geometry, as well as declarations by landowners of the believed boundaries of their land.

In ancient Babylon around 1200 BC, a limestone tablet known as the Babylonian Kudurru was inscribed and set in the land. This boundary stone, the earliest known example of one, held the description of the property, the name of the surveyor and the owner, and the ownership history. This stone also contained lengthy curses for anyone who would deny the owner's right to the land or move the stone. This early tablet represents one of today's land surveying methods, which is the placing of a boundary stone or other marker at the corner of the property.

By 500 BC, the Greeks had adopted many Egyptian surveying techniques. It is known that mathematicians including Thales and Pythagoras traveled to Egypt to study geometry, returning to impart their knowledge on mathematicians and surveyors in Greece. In Greece, legendary figures, including Aristotle, Plato, and Archimedes made the city of Alexandria a great center of science, surveying, and related endeavors.

The Roman Empire is another civilization noted for its land surveying prowess. The Romans established land surveying as an official profession; land surveyors in this time were known as agrimensores. From the first century AD, agrimensores in Rome were known for creating perfect straight lines and right angles. These lines would be used to dig shallow trenches, some of which are still in existence to this day. Many Roman surveying methods were based on those used in ancient Egypt and Greece. Some surveying tools have been uncovered at the site of Pompeii, covered in ash in the year 79 AD. Although ancient maps and land surveys were much less accurate than today's, it is quite impressive that they were created without the use of GPS and other sophisticated technologies.
