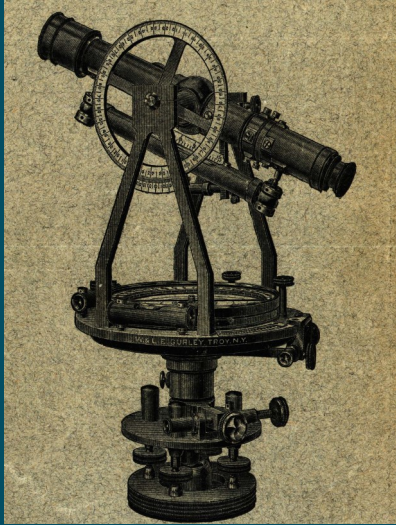

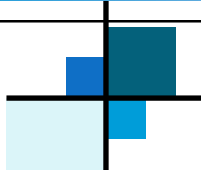

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE:

Presidents Message:

Hello everybody, my name is Andy Cleveland. I would like to start by saying thank you to the Northeast Chapter for the opportunity to serve as your President.

I started my land surveying journey in September of 1993 as a high school co-op student working for Carow Land Surveying in Appleton. I remember very clearly the day my co-op teacher came up to me and told me he had an opportunity for me. I was in football at the time, and was less than motivated to get a part-time job. When my teacher handed me the phone number, I told him I would contact them tomorrow, he said bull\$%@#, let's do it now! He grabbed me by the arm, walked me into his office, dialed the number, handed me the phone and said "ask for Bob Reider." The next thing I knew, it was the next day and I pulled into the parking lot at Carow Land Surveying. I had no idea what a survey company did! I thought I was going to a landscaping company! I walked in, met Lou Carow and shortly thereafter, I met Bob Reider. I think the only thing I did right that day was show up 5 minutes early, and dress appropriately for an interview. Bob asked me a few questions, had me attempt to scale something (I was unsuccessful), pulled out a plat book and showed me the different quadrants of a Section (I thought he was nuts), and then, by some miracle, told me I could start tomorrow.... To this day I could not tell you if I was on foot or horseback!

It is truly amazing when you look back, how many people's fingerprints have left their mark along the way in helping make a person who they are, despite our best efforts to screw it up! I am very fortunate to have had so many people help me along the way.

I was with Carow from September of 1993 to October of 2007 when I made the transition from the Valley to Green Bay. The differences between working in the Valley compared to Green Bay are staggering. After ten and a half years, I still can't point North if I am standing in the middle of the city. I also miss the convenience of going a half mile in any direction and being able to not only hit a government corner, but be able to easily identify where and what it is! I started with Mach IV about 6 months after they opened their doors earlier that year. In 2010 I took over the Survey Department. While that sounds impressive, I was the only one in the survey department! Over the past 8 years we have added 3 full time members to the survey department. I am very fortunate to work with such a talented team!

I attended a seminar this past February pertaining to service related businesses, Engineers, Surveyors, General Contractors, etc. The number one complaint of the consumer in dealing with service related businesses was not having their phone calls returned. Even if you are unable to meet the needs of the consumer, please graciously decline, and leave the consumer with a positive experience when interacting with our profession.

Please remember to take advantage of the many opportunities the Northeast Chapter offers through the meetings, seminars, and volunteering. Our spring seminar on March 23rd pertaining to shore land zoning, and floodplain was excellent! Please thank Terry Van Hout next time you see him for putting another great event together. 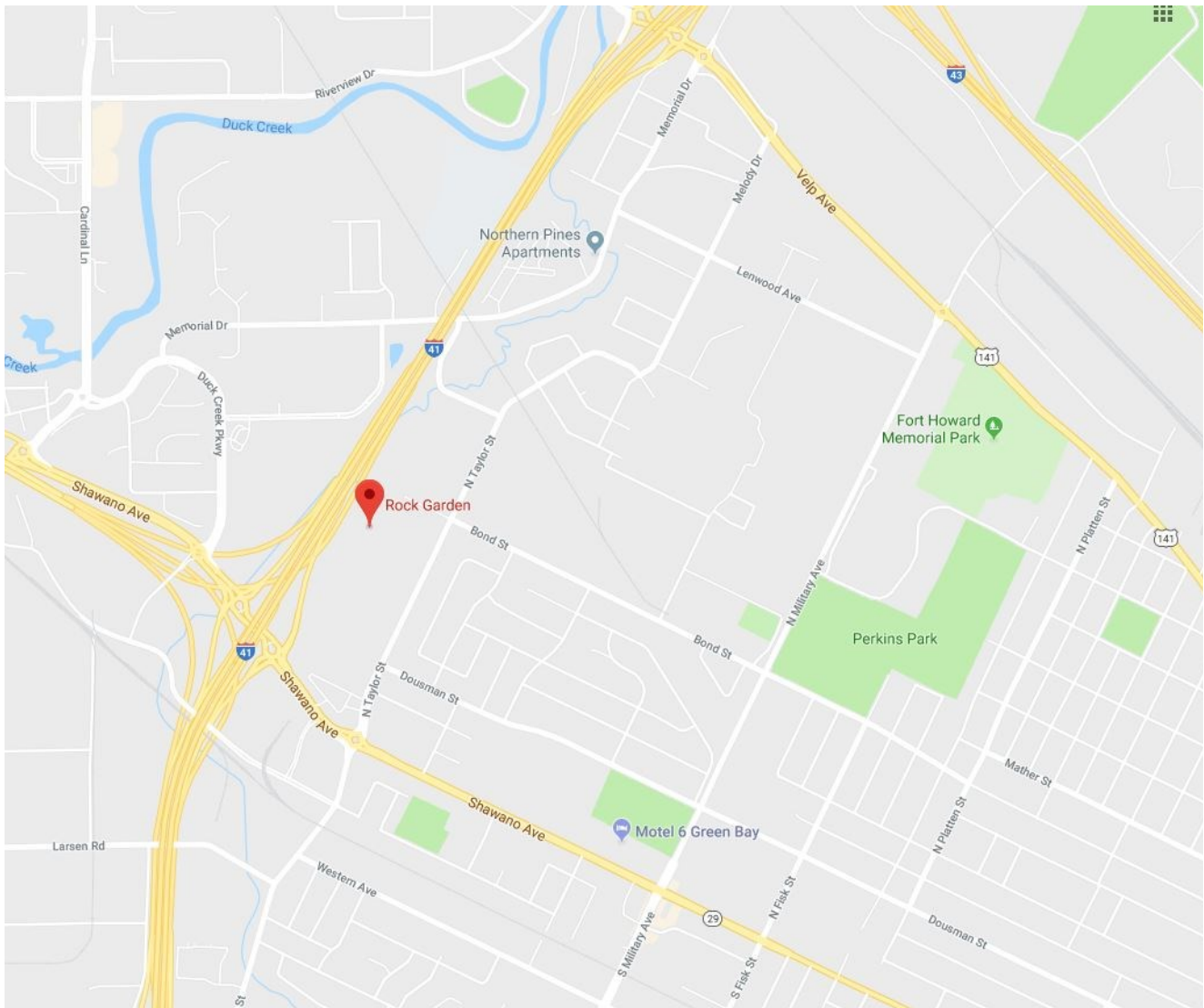

2018 WINTER GENERAL MEETING MINUTES

January 11, 2018 – Swan Club in De Pere, WI

The 2018 Winter General Meeting was held on January 11, 2018 at The Ravine in De Pere, WI. There were 74 members present, including 10 students, when Chapter President Troy Hewitt introduced:

Presentation

Josh Schaefer & Kate Osborn from Knight-Barry Title Company discussed ALTA surveys from the side of Title Insurance. The discussion included:

- Owner policies, loan policies
- Title commitments: Schedule A, B-1, B-2, #1-8 initial standards, with 6-8 ALTA specific
- Endorsements – over 100 possible. Which one? Each lender is different
- Determining Table A requirements, or “Surveyors Checklist” – getting all sides to tell the others what is needed, including subsurface easements
- Zoning endorsements are not always shared between municipality and surveyor or title company
- Easements and their location. Anything in field NOT recorded should be shown as the underwriters use this information when determining exceptions needed. Ex: satellite dish or awning off side of building and into right-of-way

President Hewitt thanked Kate and Josh for the presentation. It created a great deal of discussion and was well received by the membership.

President Hewitt then called the General Meeting to order at 7:32 pm

They have been stored both ways for quite a while. They are just doing away with the paper copy in the office. That being said, they need to know what you want done with the

original. They have created an agreement called "Swift". This agreement gives you choices on what gets done with the original CSM. They would still like you to leave a 3 x 3 inch square in the right hand corner of the CSMs to expedite recording. It helps get the document through the process quicker. It also allows for a more professional looking computer stamp instead of hand stamping the document

- *Statewide PLSS Database to be developed*

The Wisconsin Department of Administration (DOA) recently finalized an agreement with the State Cartographer's Office (SCO) for a Version 4 Statewide Parcel Map Database Project (V4). V4 is the fourth phase of the larger Statewide Digital Parcel Map Initiative, DOA's multi-year plan to develop a statewide parcel database as established by Act 20, the state's 2013-15 biennial budget bill, and detailed in state statute 59.72. Increased efficiency in data intake and aggregation processing over previous phases of the parcel initiative have provided an opportunity to take Wisconsin's efforts in statewide GIS to

the next level. Thus V4 will include the collection and aggregation of local Public Land Survey System (PLSS) corner data, culminating in an initial statewide PLSS database

LEGISLATIVE (Ed Harvey)*

- Wetlands Bill is heading for the Governor's desk. It basically states if 10,000 square feet or less – no issue. Over 10,000, then mitigation is needed



ONE CONSERVATION CONGRESS STALWART

Edgar "Ed" Harvey plans to retire next year from his job as Sheboygan County surveyor and highway engineer after 30 years on the job. Sportsmen can only hope Harvey does not decide to retreat from his prodigious support and 39 years of volunteer work with the Conservation Congress and related groups.

First elected in 1978, Harvey has been re-elected continuously since then, a testament to the trust and respect his fellow Sheboygan County sportsmen have for him. He wasted no time moving up through the Congress ranks to the executive committee, where he served as secretary from 1995-97 and again from 2000-01. Harvey served as vice chair from 2001 to 2006 when he was elected chair, serving until 2011. Thus, for 10 years, he served at the top posts within the Conservation Congress.

Election to any of those leadership positions requires a thorough vetting process that begins at the county level where election as one of five delegates requires a vote of 50 percent, plus one of the citizens from one's county. The next hurdle is election to the district leadership council (DLC, formerly executive council) by the delegates from each district - 11 such districts exist, each one consisting of up to eight county delegations. The DLC represents the last checkpoint where delegates choose their repre-

sentatives on the executive committee.

He has served as chair of his county delegation during most of his tenure on the Congress and now is also chair of the Sheboygan County Deer Advisory Council. He has been active throughout his involvement with the Congress at the advisory committee level where he has chaired three committees: air, waste and water; forestry and parks; and fur harvest, on which he serves as co-chair.

In addition, Harvey has represented the Congress on the DNR Fur Committee, the DNR Deer Committee, the DNR Beaver Task Force, the Legislative Council on Private Forestry Programs, and on the Conservation Hall of Fame board of directors.

At the local level he has been a member of the Ridge Runners Sportsmen's Club in Cascade for 43 years, serving at various times as secretary and president, while also representing the club on the Sheboygan County Conservation Association. He has served in every leadership position that organization has to

offer.

"Perhaps the most remarkable thing about Ed Harvey's involvement is that he never says no when it's time to get things done," said Conservation Congress chair Larry Bonde. "He always comes through, always with great enthusiasm and with an innate understanding of what needs to be done. He's one of the most inspirational guys I have ever met." Harvey caught the conservation bug early on.

"By the time I first ran for a seat on the Congress, I had already been regularly attending the spring hearings," said Harvey. "I was impressed with the service it offered to ordinary citizens to contribute to, and influence, rule-making here in Wisconsin.

"Then-chairman Bill Murphy called it 'democracy in shirt sleeves,' while Natural Resources Board chair, Christine Thomas, called it 'a great romantic ideal.' "The work and the accomplishments of these 360 elected, unpaid delegates is truly inspirational. They are incredible people who have, over the past 80-plus years, accumulated an incredible body of work," he said.

Harvey cites the April 2001 spring hearings as the pinnacle of public involvement in conservation when 30,800 sportsmen and a large contingent of animal protectionists came to the hearings to vote on the proposal to create a dove season in Wisconsin.

"Dove hunting had been going on all over the country for years," Harvey said. "It should not have been a big deal but those hearings are believed to be the largest rule-making hearing in the history of the United States. That's incredible.

"What is more incredible is the fact that, here in Wisconsin, one guy stood up at a meeting and was able to start all that. It is great to be part of an organization that so enables our citizens," said Harvey.

Harvey's years of volunteer work and accomplishments mark him as one of the greatest success stories in the annals of the Wisconsin Conservation Congress.
