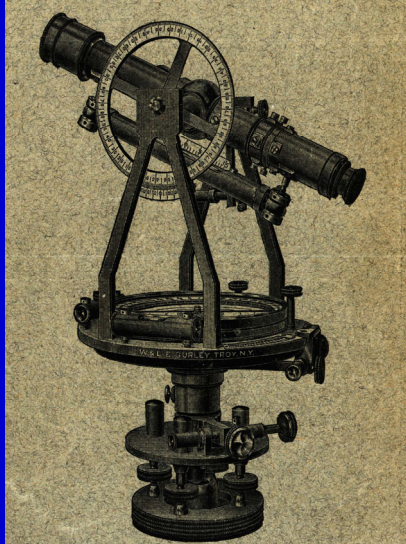

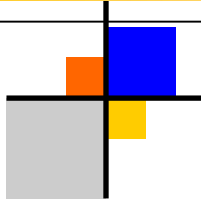

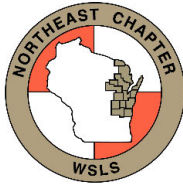

- Students were somewhat involved in helping run this year’s Institute, with many helping at the check-in booth – not much for moderating though

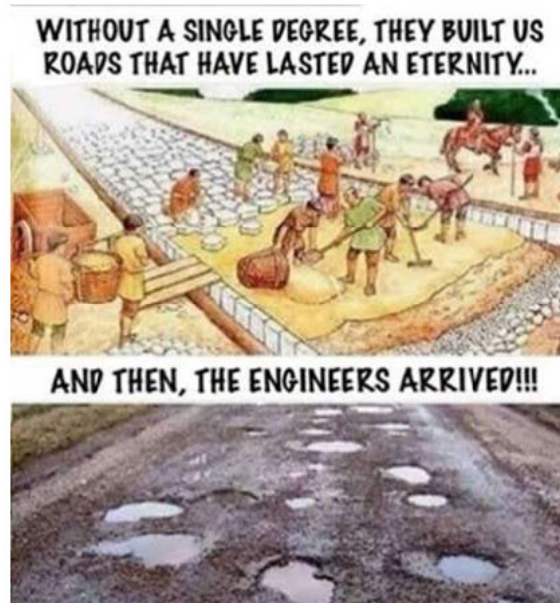

I would like to begin this report by thanking you all for your support of the young surveyor voice in 2022.

January Your 2022 Officers: Jeanette Harley, President, Connor Christopherson, Vice President, Theo Grover, Secretary. Our meeting at the WLSL Institute was successful with 51 young surveyors and supporters in attendance. We would like to extend a special thank you to Past-President Ed Harvey, President Bryan Meyer and NSPS Director Dick Kleinman for speaking to our group. NSPS Executive Director Tim Burch was also a welcomed guest. Connor Christopherson and Katy Kuecker spoke on exam prep and their experiences. Licensure is a heavily discussed topic in our group, especially taking exams. The Young Surveyors Bucky's Challenge team had a full table year. While we did not place at the top, we also did not place at the bottom. Young Surveyor of the year was past YSN officer, Devin Bailey. The 4th annual YSN Bowling was a huge success with an excellent turnout of young surveyors and supporters. Thank you to the WLSL and vendors who sponsored YSN events this year! Overall, we saw an uptick in young surveyors attending this year's institute and participating in other YSN events.

Background:

This year's NSPS student competition took place in D.C. As opposed to competitions in the past, this year's competition was organized and carried out by YSN. Teams arrived Tuesday evening for a meeting where the rules for the first part of the competition were explained. Teams from Michigan, California, Idaho, Washington, Illinois, Texas, Puerto Rico.

Wednesday March 30th:

The 13 teams met at 8 am to do a monument hunt around the city. The teams were released in 15 minute intervals to avoid teams following each other and had 8 hours to find as many monuments as they could. The monuments were uploaded into an ARC GIS program which provided the location of the monuments on a map and a NGS data sheet associated with that monument. The monuments consisted of traditional brass monuments, original stone corners of D.C., the Washington Monument, finials and so on. Each team was assigned a young surveyor to follow them. The teams could use any means of travel necessary (metro, uber, scooter, etc.). The young surveyors were there to document each monument the teams went to by taking a picture of the monument and assure that each monument was actually visited. Young surveyors were also there to mentor and answer any questions the students might have had without directly helping. Bonus points were given to teams that posted the monuments to social media.

Thursday March 31st:

Thursday's portion of the competition consisted of three parts; a level loop, a traverse and a triangulation exercise. The field work took place in Banneker Park and in close vicinity to the Washington monument. Students were given extra points for dressing in period clothing.

For the level loop each team ran a loop and were graded on their closure on the starting point, the balance of their setups and field notes.

For the traverse, students were tasked with completing a traverse with a chain and a staff compass. They were graded on closure and field notes.

For the triangulation exercise students were given the coordinates of two points and tasked with calculating the coordinates of a third known coordinate. They were graded on their accuracy and professionalism.

Upon completion of these exercises, students had until 6 pm to turn in their field notes. Young surveyors condensed these calculations into a spreadsheet for the judges. A social event was held at a venue called Punch Bowl Social for young surveyors, students, advisors and NSPS directors.

Friday April 1st:

The YSN meeting started on Friday morning and consisted of discussing the student competition and getting to know young surveyors from these different states. We discussed doing run-throughs on the student competition with young surveyors in the days before the competition and how the monument hunt was a great exercise to continue in the future.

YSN DAM TOUR!

October We held our annual WSLs YSN camping float weekend September 16-18. This year, we had the special privilege to tour the Alliant Energy Dam in Prairie du Sac on Friday. Tyler Bergstorm, one of our young surveyors who worked with Alliant, detailed the surveyor's responsibilities at the Dam including monitoring and construction. Tyler was instrumental in setting up the tour as few have been given this opportunity since 2020. Kathryn Wilhelm, Site Manager gave a presentation on the history of the dam, current operations and construction activities, and tour of the facilities. Ask to see more pictures.



Friday night we had additional young surveyors join us for a gourmet campfire dinner of chicken and sweet corn, yard games and surveyor discussion. Alysen was the camp host and chef, getting permission for the group to camp on her family's property on the Wisconsin River.

Saturday, we grabbed Breakfast at the local diner Eagle Inn and headed out to the water. With finicky weather predictions, we changed our course for Fish and Mud Lakes. For those of you that don't know, I worked at Foth when the lake association came up with a plan to install pumps and water main to keep the lake at a controlled level. Cue a few years later, and a couple 1000 year storm events. Nothing was able to keep the lake from flooding its normal height and consumed several homes. There is no outlet and the pumps are no longer able to work. Makes for a neat adventure though to be able to kayak literally over the road and next to the houses that still remain. Alex and Sabrina fished and were successful with a few bluegill and bass bites.

Off the water, we made an impromptu tour of Wollersheim Winery & Distillery. We enjoyed some signature craft cocktails and took in the beautiful scenery rich in local history. After lunch, a few brave young surveyors scaled to the top of Ferry Bluff for a different perspective on the Wisconsin River and surrounding landscape.

Sunday, we packed up camp and headed in different directions. Special thanks to Alysen Tierny, Past President for organizing and hosting this event. In all, 13 surveyors attended. A good mixture of seasoned, young, students, and future.

The NSPS YSN met online for a lunch Go to meeting on July 13th. The idea behind it is for groups to meet and share quick updates over lunch. This way groups can interact with each other more often about events and feedback on growing the state's individual networks. The meeting was very well received and participated in and another will be scheduled after the fall meeting.

December Megan Theune-Baillargeon and Jeanette Harley attended the NSPS YSN Fall meeting in Tulsa, OK on behalf of WSLs YSN. We arrived Wednesday and had time to explore Tulsa before meeting up with other YSN Reps for impromptu Social Events. Thursday Morning the young surveyors integrated into the various NSPS Committees to provide input from the young surveyor perspective and to see how the committees function on a national level. I (Jeanette Harley) attended the following committee meetings:



Workforce Development: Tim Murphy Chair Has been very active and keeps information posted on NSPS to keep people in the loop. Only core members are part of the email chain so that they stay on task with their goals. Latest project success has been coming up with a video presentation to help surveyors give a united message on careers in surveying to schools and to provide a tool to those not sure of where to start with a presentation. It is completely customizable to fit your state's information. When this is ready for release, it seems appropriate to share with each state's Workforce Development, for WSLs that may be Outreach? Christy Davis gave an update on NCEES published results from their survey. I have a copy of the powerpoint if anyone is interested in that information. NCEES seems to be

going their own way with using this information to market to attract individuals to the profession but Christy has a good relationship with the person in charge of creating the marketing materials so NSPS may have some input. Some follow-up I noted to do was to see what the trends of licenses in Wisconsin are. North Carolina had their legislature reduce the requirements of license but fortunately was able to get on the offense and protect their rules. Trent Keenan has been creating an awesome poster of the path to surveying that you can customize with your state's info and GKIS mascot. He encouraged simply postcards with QR codes as opposed to brochures as a quick means to share important links to students, counselors, etc. Maine ran a workforce development week on surveying and had classes full. Tennessee attended an FFA conference and was able to reach 200-300 new contacts. J B gave an update on TAPS with funds earmarked for helping veterans transition into careers (opportunity for surveying).

Scouting Committee: David Collier NSPS has not yet been formally invited to be part of the changes to the Surveying Merit Badge. The rewrite is planned for January 2023. The Scout Jamboree will be held in West Virginia next year. 20 surveying merit badge counselors are needed for this effort. July 19-28. This committee meets once a month and I am happy to share the proposed changes to the Badge requirements and other notes for the meeting via email to anyone interested.

We began the NSPS YSN meeting Thursday afternoon with introductions from each member present and updates on the various YSNs. Jeanette Harley gave an update on the YSN activities in Wisconsin. WSLs can be proud that Wisconsin is one of the most established YSNs and provides guidance to other states. A total of 17 young surveyors were in attendance in person with a few joining online with the following states represented: Utah, Nevada, Michigan, Minnesota, Illinois, Oklahoma, Indiana, New York, Colorado, Idaho, North Dakota, South Dakota, Georgia, and Wisconsin. Emily Hart from New Hampshire joined online. We had 5 guest speakers and lifetime YSN member John Hohol present representing FIG. Arizona has recently started up a YSN and is growing rapidly. Many of the YSNs have a presence of social media and welcome you to follow them for updates. We took time to discuss our experiences in each of the NSPS committees, sharing updates and thoughts of what we hope to see accomplished. We opened the floor



and nominated officers for secretary and Vice President. Please check out a recent Surveyors Says to learn more about the candidates.

The second part of our meeting was conducted on Friday morning with Jacob Heck giving his experience attending the FIG working week in Poland to give an idea of what to expect with the US hosting next year in Orlando. Jacob is scheduled to give this same presentation during our YSN meeting at the institute and we look forward to his attendance. Jacob will be serving as the next NSPS YSN President come Spring 2023. We then switched gears and worked through our new website updating state coordinator information and learning to add posts and events. <https://youngsurveyors.org/> The NSPS YSN is going to conduct its first photo contest to generate more user content on social media. 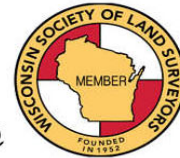


