



2007 WSLS President Lisa Van Horn

Lisa spoke of the pending Peer Review Committee's proposed AE-7 checklist. A handout was distributed (some received an emailed .pdf file). The main topics of discussion were:

- A large portion of maps collected from around the State are deficient and not meeting the minimum standards of AE-7, with most missing a proper legal description
- The checklist could be used by anyone who deals with map making or recording: County Surveyors, Register of Deeds, Property Listers, Surveyors; as it contains vital information pertaining to the various requirements and standards of AE-7
- The President's Poll is now on WSLS website www.wsls.org It asks your opinion on 8 questions concerning your views on what constitutes a survey – simply "Vote", and with instant results you can see how you compare to other State surveyors and AE-7

Please visit the WSLS website and vote in the poll. The results will help in determining the direction of the committee.

President Bob Reider thanked our guest speaker & special guest for their presentations. He then called the general meeting to order at 7:21 pm.

A motion was *made*, seconded and approved to accept the General Meeting minutes of July 12, 2007.

A motion was *made, seconded and approved* to accept the Treasurer's Report as presented in the July 2007 Newsletter (with additional deposit)

Newsletter Editors Report (Jeff Meneau)

- Email vs. Snail mail is around 50-50
- Students, previously not on the email newsletter list, will now receive the newsletter by email (if provided)

WSLS Report (John Baudhuin)

- The last meeting was held August 4, 2007 in Minocqua.
- A recent Supreme Court decision on severability (FAS, LLC v. Town of Bass Lake) led to a discussion concerning the Society's related legislation on the space between the OHWM and the water's edge or on a non-meandered lake. Legislative Committee Chair will discuss the matter further with the WSLS attorney
- Ethics & Standards Chairman Jaquish reported on his attendance at the meeting of the Land Surveyor Section of the Registration Board. He noted that a revised AE-6 will soon be published and the licensing application form will be accompanied by a position paper. The position paper route was used to avoid the cumbersome process of changing the wording of the various rules stated on the application. The section also covered the on-going problem of the length of time it takes to process a complaint against a surveyor, usually caused by a lack of timely responses from the accused. A motion was proposed to support a Wisconsin Administrative Code change to enable the Land Surveyor Section of the Dept. of Regulations to set a timetable on responses to communications regarding disciplinary actions. Failure to respond within the stated time would be grounds for suspension of license privileges. The Dept. would have the right to waive this requirement.
- Peer Review will now be an Ad Hoc committee instead of being a part of the E&S Committee as agreed by President Van Horn and E&S Chairman Jaquish. Surveys have been collected from several counties and now the committee will review and scrutinize the suggested proposal.
- The 2007 Summer Meeting in Minocqua was well attended. The Northern Lakes Chapter was

- commended for an outstanding two-day event, including perfect weather!
- The Locating Company will receive a letter advising them of Wisconsin's statutes and administrative code which prohibits them from their activities should they decide to consider Wisconsin, with a copy of the letter going to the Division of Consumer Protection and the Better Business Bureau
- A motion was approved for WSLS's support of proposed legislation (SB-444), pending the opportunity to review the final draft

Auditing Committee (Dale Raisleger)

No report at this time

CST Committee (Jim Westerman)

- Everyone is gearing up for the upcoming exam at the Institute. All students are encouraged to check out how CST can help their careers. The cost is relatively inexpensive, with the final cost reduced to around \$30 (\$110 normally) using the NE Chapter & State's contributions
- Employers should consider requiring CST to be part of an applicants resume
- Applicants get the "credit" from NE Chapter and the State <u>only</u> if they are members of each organization. The credit is for Level 1 testing <u>only</u>
- The eligibility standards for applicants is being tweaked to better describe who is allowed to take the test

Ethics and Practices (Tom Leslie)

- No requests for complaint forms have been received since 2005
- Lisa Van Horn has kept members well informed on the creation of a statewide Peer Review Committee. This committee will tackle many issues that deal with ethics and practices, relating not only to individual surveyors but to the whole profession as well

2008 Farm Tech Days (Jim Wallen)

- County Surveyors Association (Jim Hebert) has not responded to the Chapter's request concerning any "toes being stepped on" and our involvement in staking "tent city"
- Jim Wallen traveled to Green County's Farm Tech Days staking, noting that it takes many volunteers to make it happen
- Culverts have been placed and gravel deposited to help create access driveways to all the farm fields, thus giving access for the heavy equipment shown during the event.
- The Chapter will receive a booth in the Applied Technology Center. Here's a link to check out the

Land Records (Pat Ford)

- On October 24th, the WSLS Land Information Committee will be meeting in Green Bay. Topics scheduled include:
 - How Government GIS benefits the surveyor
 - Surveyor involvement in local & state decisions
 - Issues affecting surveyors in building & using GIS
- Surveyor leadership opportunities in WLIA
- WisDOT is working on Phase 8 of the height modernization project, with Phase 8A covering most of NE Wisconsin: Kewaunee, Door, N 2/3 of Brown, NE corner of Outagamie, eastern 2/3 of Shawano, SE 2/3 of Oconto and SE 1/3 of Marinette. The monuments will be in as soon as possible. The density will not be as great in past phases. Also, no timetable has been set for the differential leveling to bring in elevations

<u>Legislative</u> (Ed Harvey)

 Lisa Van Horn stated that legislation AB-496, which deals with open records and allowing search by name on public sites, should be watched closely. This bill could lead to big changes in the way land information is made available






