

2010 FALL General Membership Meeting Northeast Chapter of WSLS

The 2010 Fall General Meeting was held on October 7, 2010 at Michiels/Fox Banquet in Appleton, WI. There were 45 members present, including 9 students, when President Dale Raisleger introduced:

SPECIAL PRESENTATION

Robert Fay, owner of Old Northwest Research, has been conducting archeological and historical research in Wisconsin since 1972. He is qualified to excavate burials and analyze human remains under Wisconsin Burial Sites Preservation Law and Administrative Rules. Bob recently completed 15 years on the State Historic Preservation Review Board and is also the Director of the Manitowoc County Historical Society. He is currently walking sections of the 1,000-mile Ice Age National Scenic Trail through Wisconsin, with 400 miles already covered.

Bob presented 5 unique cases, all of which, in part, used original government notes and maps to ascertain the location of historic sites, including the Battle of Pecatonica in Wiota (Blackhawk Indian War), old growth forest in Manitowoc County, charcoal kilns on the Fox River near De Pere, and a lumber and quarry site near Garrett Bay in Liberty Grove.

President Raisleger thanked Robert Fay for a very interesting and informative presentation. He then called the General Meeting to order at 8:45 pm

A motion was made, seconded and approved to accept the General Meeting minutes of July 15, 2010

A motion was made, seconded and approved to accept the Treasurer's Report as presented in the October 2010 Newsletter

The following reports were given:

Newsletter Editors Report (Jeff Meneau)

 Computer problems delayed the sending out of the October newsletter. All problems have been corrected and should be back to normal for the next newsletter

WSLS Report (John Baudhuin)

- The summer meeting was held on August 14, 2010 in New Glarus, WI
- President Jimmy Rein reported the main activity since the Annual meeting has been work on the new website
- WSLS and UWSP have signed contracts with the Kalahari through 2020, with room costs remaining at \$99 and hopefully available for anyone staying the weekend (after the Institute)
- The 2011 Annual Institute is very close to having a full schedule of presentations
- 3 individuals have expressed interest in being candidates for WSLS. Also needed are candidates for NSPS Governor and WSLS Treasurer
- Foundation funds have dwindled in recent years, around \$177K (down from \$225K).
 Scholarships will remain at last year's rate
- John Matonich spoke to the membership about recent NSPS activities – and talked about the withdrawal process from ACSM
- Tony Blumentritt, Minnesota President, reported on the St. Cloud State University survey program, noting changes to key positions and a layoff notice given to one of the staff for next spring. It is important to both WI & MN that St. Cloud State keep a quality surveying program

Trig*Star Committee


The Trig*Star program is sponsored by the National Society of Professional Surveyors and was created in 1983. The program's major purpose is to introduce land surveying to high school students, while showing them that the trigonometry they are learning has a practical application in the working world

Responsibilities include the following:

- Selecting and contacting high school teachers who are currently teaching trigonometry
- Meet with math department and coordinate dates and times to present the program to interested students
- Register the school(s) with NSPS by submitting application and fees for exam. Solicit sponsorships with other chapter firms or individuals
- Prepare a 30-45 minute presentation, including topics such as the history of land surveying, prominent surveyors of the past, how surveying contributes to our way of life and why surveying is a viable career option
- Present the program to the students
- Schedule testing dates with the schools and confirm the number of students interested in taking the exam
- Notify the school's newspaper as well as local news media
- Organize a team to assist in the proctoring of the exam. You will need
 at least two people. The exam is a combination of having the most
 correct answers in the shortest amount of time. A stopwatch is needed
- Administer the exam, and immediately score them
- Contact the winners and schedule a time to present them with the award money and certificates
- Submit test results to the WSLS Trig*Star representative and to NSPS
