





#### 2011 FALL GENERAL MEETING MINUTES October 13, 2011 – Stone Toad Bar & Grill in Menasha, WI

The 2011 Fall General Meeting was held on October 13, 2011 at Stone Toad Bar & Grill in Menasha, WI. There were 50 members present, including 10 students when President Terry Van Hout introduced:

#### SPECIAL PRESENTATIONS

Brad Pagels, local railroad & logging line historian, gave a very interesting presentation on "Logging Railroad Archeology". He spoke on his years of experience in detecting and locating old logging railroad lines, particularly on northern Wisconsin for this presentation.

#### Some points from the discussion:

- Center of Sections were set in Kewaunee County during the 1980s, with the first County Surveyor setting comers using occupation and the current County Surveyor using the BLM methodology
- A recent County resolution stated that published & GIS corner locations will honor previous County Surveyor work, and straight line intersect being used now
- Some members spoke about possibly using different methods of setting center of sections (equidistant, fence lines, etc) as straight line intersect is not always the best option to use
- BLM is a guide ... not the rule
- Differences in centers could point to a problem with one of the 1/4 comers

President Van Hout thanked both Shane and Steve for excellent presentations and allowing for good group discussion He then called the General Meeting to order at 8:50 pm

The program's major purpose is to introduce land surveying to high school students, while showing them that the trigonometry they are learning has a practical application in the working world

#### Responsibilities include the following:

- Selecting and contacting high school teachers who are currently teaching trigonometry
- Meet with math department and coordinate dates and times to present the program to interested students
- Register the school(s) with NSPS by submitting application and fees for exam. Solicit sponsorships with other chapter firms or individuals
- Prepare a 30-45 minute presentation, including topics such as the history of land surveying, prominent surveyors of the past, how surveying contributes to our way of life and why surveying is a viable career option
- Present the program to the students
- Schedule testing dates with the schools and confirm the number of students interested in taking the exam
- Notify the school's newspaper as well as local news media
- Organize a team to assist in the proctoring of the exam. You will need at least two people. The exam is a combination of having the most correct
  answers in the shortest amount of time. A stopwatch is needed
- Administer the exam, and immediately score them
- Contact the winners and schedule a time to present them with the award money and certificates
- Submit test results to the WSLS Trig\*Star representative and to NSPS
- Report any committee activity to the General Membership and Board of Director meetings


