### 2015 FALL GENERAL MEETING MINUTES October 15, 2015 – The Rite Place in Bellevue, WI

#### Special Presentation

Ed Harvey, NE Chapter member, PLS and Sheboygan County Surveyor gave a presentation on his book entitled "Great Surveys and Surveyors of Sheboygan County".

First printed in 2007, this book deals with many of Ed Harvey's predecessors as She boygan County Surveyors. Ed, after years of research, found that they included men of great character, and others whom we could term "shysters". They included some pretty unremarkable individuals and others of great genius. Although they were humble surveyors while they worked in Sheboygan County, some of these men invented great things, or were otherwise involved in major events which changed the history of the entire nation or the world. One man worked on the Brooklyn Bridge project. Another worked on the Panama Canal. At least two of these men prepared maps which shaped the boundaries of nations. With all the same care, the same men prepared surveys which depicted the boundaries of comparatively small, private properties in Sheboygan County

President Nordwig thanked Mr. Harvey for his presentation, and then called the General Meeting to order at 8:04 pm

#### Land Records (Ryan Duckart)

 DOA announces creation of a Wisconsin Land Information Council

This council will serve in an advisory role to the Department of Administration (DOA) in the administration of the Wisconsin Land Information Program (WLIP). This includes WLIP County Land Information Plans, WLIP grant applications, and the Statewide Parcel Mapping Initiative. The council is slated to have 12 appointed members serving staggered 3-year terms in addition to the state Geographic Information Officer (GIO) serving as non-voting Secretary to the Council. Of the 12 appointed members, two members are specified to be professional land surveyors, one member being from the private-sector, and one from the public-sector. V arious statewide stakeholder organizations provided feedback and counter-proposals during the discussion process ensuring broad stakeholder representation on the Council. This gives the land surveyors in this state a voice in advising the DOA how to administer a program that provides over \$9 million annually in public funding to Wisconsin counties for the modernization of local land records. Examples of some of the projects that WLIP helps to fund include, PLSS remonum entation and GPS efforts, county parcel mapping, and increasing the availability of online land records.

As a stakeholder in the WLIP, the WSLS has been asked to nominate a member of their organization to represent the land surveyors in the state as the private-sector land surveyor on this council. The WSLS Board has started the process of selecting a candidate. Applications to serve on the council are due by August 7th, 2015 and can be found on the WLIP webpage at:

# **Auditing Committee**

Responsible for reviewing the financial records of the Northeast Wisconsin Chapter at the end of every fiscal year (December 31) to ensure that all finances are in order, and report these findings at the Winter Board Meeting in February and at the Spring General Membership Meeting in April

### **CST Committee**

Responsibilities include the following:

Promote the Certified Survey Technician (CST) Program within the Northeast Chapter through local colleges, surveying/engineering firms, municipalities and other local government offices relating to land surveying; provide proctors for CST exams as needed; coordinate exams with the NSPS; work closely with the Northeast Chapter Board and WSLS CST Committee; report any committee activity at the Board of Director and General Membership meetings

### **Legislative Committee**

Responsibilities include monitor and report any legislation concerning land surveying

### **Ethics & Practices Committee**

Responsibilities include the following:

Supply complaint forms and information to all that request; review and process all complaint forms received in as quick and timely a manner as possible according to the published timeline printed on the back of the complaint form; facilitate a resolution that is satisfactory to both complainant and surveyor; report all complaints (and results) to the NE Chapter Board; forward all unresolved plaints to the State Ethics & Practices Committee; report any committee activity at the Board of Director and General Membership meetings

### **Land Records Committee**

Responsibilities include the following:

Monitor and represent the land surveyor's role and interests in the development of land information programs; promote interest and participation of our Society members in the Wisconsin Land Information Association; communicate and coordinate tasks with the WSLS Land Information Committee; report any committee activity at the Board of Director and General Membership meetings

# **Membership Committee**

Responsibilities include the following:

Promote the benefits of Chapter membership; report paid membership totals at all General Meetings; contact (by letter) all new land surveying registrants residing/working within the NE Chapter area. Offer a free one year membership to NE Chapter; report any committee activity to the General Membership and Board of Director meetings

# **Nominating Committee**

Responsibilities include the following:

In the fall, canvas existing Chapter Officers to see if they will seek re-election or vacate their office; check to see if the Chapter Representative to WSLS is up for election; poll membership to find willing candidates for open positions; present candidate names for elections at the annual meeting of the general membership, report any committee activity to the General Membership and Board of Director meetings

# **Program Committee**

Responsibilities include the following:

Arrange guest speakers for meetings; coordinate the Summer Golf and Trap Shoot; coordinate prizes for the Summer Golf and Trap Shoot; any additional charges requested by the Board of Directors; report any committee activity to the General Membership and Board of Director meetings

### **Public Relations Committee**

Responsibilities include the following:

Promote our NE Chapter and WSLS at various trade shows throughout the year, which could include the following: WLIA annual conference exhibit booth held in March; National Railroad Museum's "Day in the Life of a Surveyor" in May; Various classroom Q & A sessions with local technical college surveying programs; educate and promote the general public on the benefits of the surveying profession and the chapter's involvement with WSLS; always look for new events to that could help educate and promote surveying; report any committee activity to the General Membership and Board of Director meetings

# **Scholarship Committee**

The Northeast Chapter awards two annual scholarships:

# Don Rhode Leadership Scholarship Northeast Wisconsin Chapter Scholarship

Eligible students must be enrolled in an accredited land surveying program, and must have residency in the Chapter area

Responsibilities include the following:

Send notices to the department heads at NWTC, Nicolet and Michigan Tech to be posted for student viewing; the Chair distributes all received applications to committee members for the selection process; winners are notified by mail and invited to the January General Membership meeting to accept the award from a Committee representative; Report any committee activity to the General Membership and Board of Director meetings

### **Seminar Committee**

Responsible for all aspects of preparing & running the annual Chapter Spring Seminar held every March.

Responsibilities include the following:

Determine topic(s) of the upcoming seminar:

Acquire presenters for both morning and afternoon sessions, pick place and time (including food & drink?), design and distribute informational fliers (w/ registration) (using both regular mail & email lists), any printed handouts or gift for guests??; set-up & prepare location before seminar, distribute & collect seminar rating sheets at seminar; various other small but important duties not listed.

Report any committee activity at the Board of Director and General Membership meetings

### **Student Representative Committee**

Responsibilities include the following:

Provide guidance to new student members; promote student membership of the NE Chapter among students enrolled in affiliated educational institution programs; coordinate involvement among student members, and students enrolled in affiliated programs to include but not limited, to: Communicate upcoming WSLS State Chapter and NEC activities, especially as it relates to education and promotion of the land surveying profession; Support and participate in NEC Committee activities such as:

Trig-Star Program

Railroad Museum "Day in the Life"

Hosting WSLS Institutes

**CST Certification** 

Arrange NE Chapter sponsored events including classroom presentations, meetings, seminars, publications, field trips, picnics, orientation; elect committee chairperson to: Lead the student committee in the charges set forth; provide representation for student members to the Board of Directors; amend any charges as directed by the Board of Directors; report any committee activity to the General Membership and Board of Director meetings

# **Trig\*Star Committee**

The Trig\*Star program is sponsored by the National Society of Professional Surveyors and was created in 1983. The program's major purpose is to introduce land surveying to high school students, while showing them that the trigonometry they are learning has a practical application in the working world

Responsibilities include the following:

Selecting and contacting high school teachers who are currently teaching trigonometry, meet with math department and coordinate dates and times to present the program to interested students; register the school(s) with NSPS by submitting application and fees for exam. Solicit sponsorships with other chapter firms or individuals; prepare a 30-45 minute presentation, including topics such as the history of land surveying, prominent surveyors of the past,

how surveying contributes to our way of life and why surveying is a viable career option; present the program to the students; schedule testing dates with the schools and confirm the number of students interested in taking the exam; notify the school's newspaper as well as local news media; organize a team to assist in the proctoring of the exam. You will need at least two people. The exam is a combination of having the most correct answers in the shortest amount of time. A stop watch is needed; administer the exam, and immediately score them; contact the winners and schedule a time to present them with the award money and certificates; submit test results to the WSLS Trig\*Star representation and to NSPS; report any committee activity to the General Membership and *Board of Director meeting*


