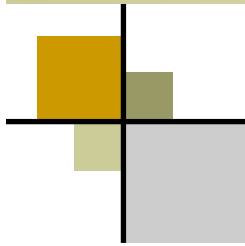

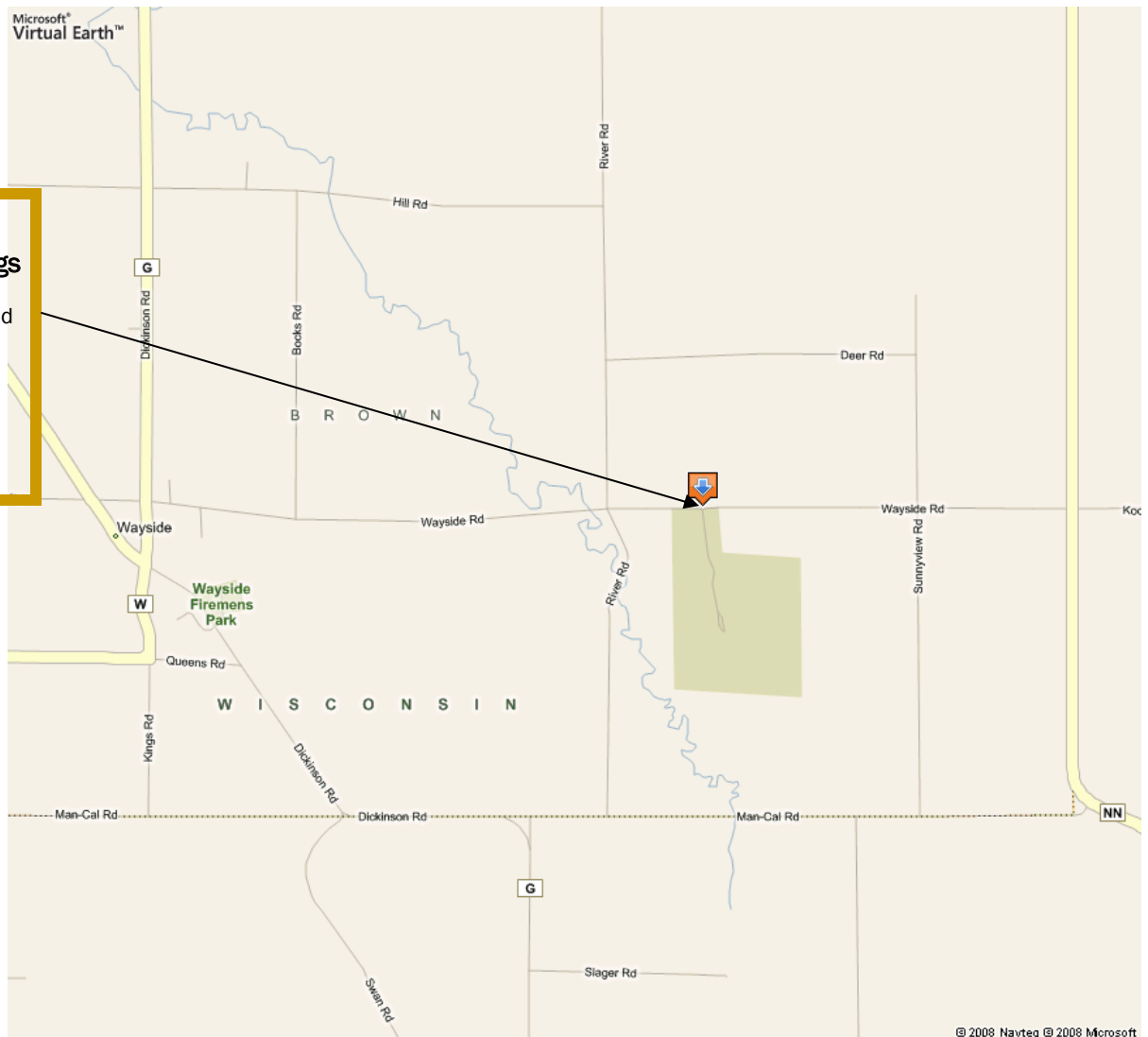

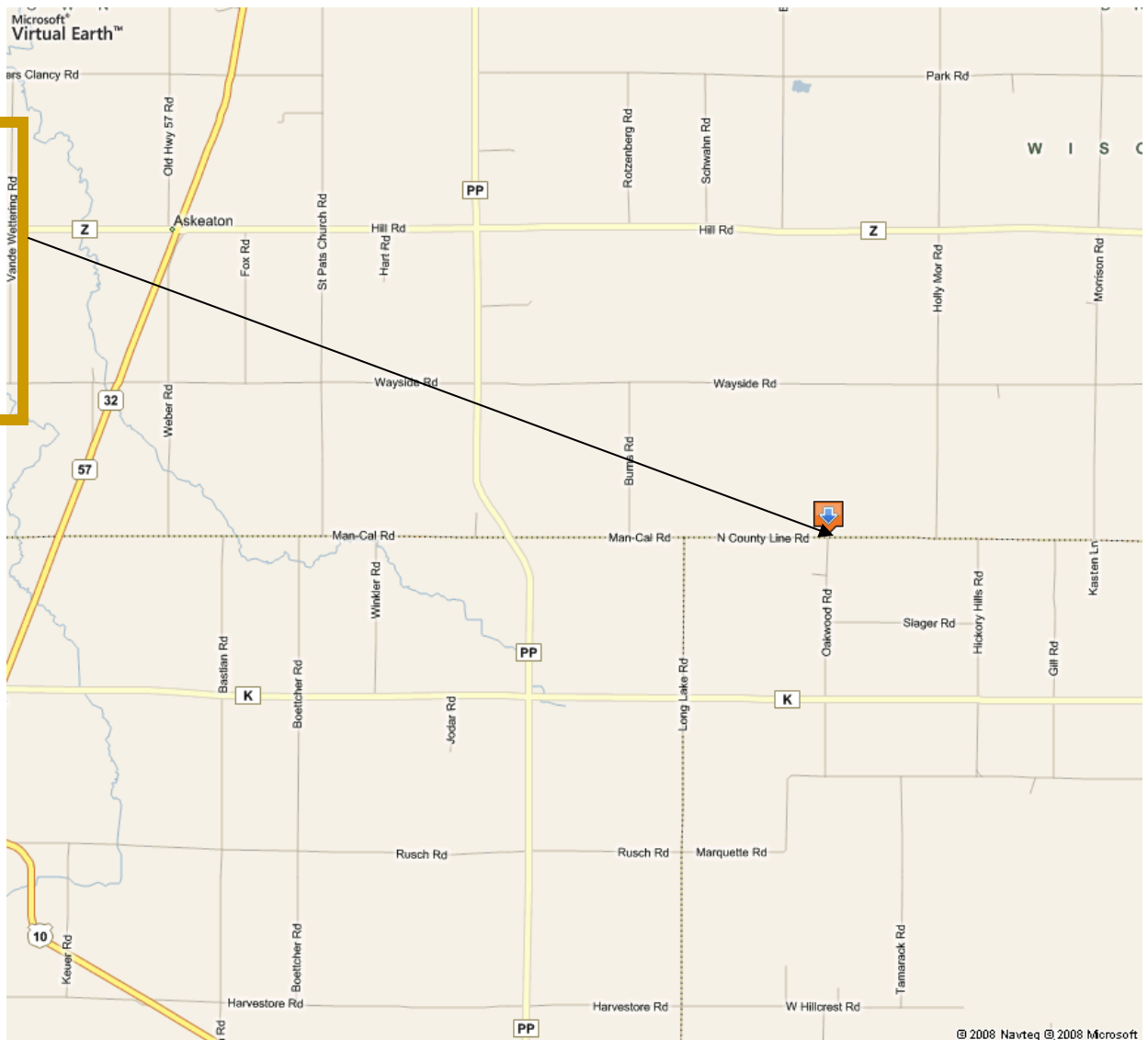

2008 SPRING**General Membership Meeting
Northeast Wisconsin Chapter of WSLs**

The 2008 Spring General Meeting was held April 8, 2008 at CJ's Banquet Hall in Kewaunee, WI. There were 57 members present, including 13 students, when President Gary Zahringer introduced:

Guest Speaker**James Havel – R.E. Lee & Associates**

Division Manager, NES Ecological Services
"Wetland Identification and Delineation Process"

James discussed the finer details of identifying wetlands by using, but not limited to, plant/vegetation recognition, soil types and hydrology. The knowledge and experience of the delineator also plays a part in the overall process

The slideshow gave examples of the types of vegetation that are good signs of a wetland area, including cattails, bur-reed, willows and pond lilies (just to name a few).

The delineation process can be long and complex, taking into account many variables, all while adhering to specific federal and state guidelines and regulations.

President Gary Zahringer thanked our guest speaker & introduced:

Special Guest**2008 WSLs President****John Casucci**

He then called the general meeting to order at 8:25 pm.

A motion was *made, seconded and approved* to accept the General Meeting minutes of January 10, 2008.

A motion was *made, seconded and approved* to accept the Treasurer's Report as presented in the April 2008 Newsletter

Newsletter Editors Report (Jeff Meneau)

- Nearly 80% receive their newsletter by email – this saves the Chapter \$\$ with every mailing!

WSLs Report (John Baudhuin)

- The last meeting was held Saturday, April 5, 2008 in Wausau
- The Institute Committee reviewed the evaluations from the last Institute. The process has already begun for next year's Institute
- NGS State Advisor has reported that CORS will be going live real soon

- Tony Gromacki reported that at the last DNR meeting on March 15, discussions included wetland mapping and a DNR website update. The DNR is also planning to create an OHWM website
- The museum has purchased an old transit that will be on display at the Washington County Museum in August or September. Lisa Van Horn is also looking for monuments or maps that are specific to Washington County to include in the exhibit
- Ethics & Practices has one complaint to review at this time. It has asked the Standards Review Committee to help in the review of the map involved before a decision can be reached
- It was suggested that the WSLs create a press release for all map contest and scholarship winners
- The Society's latest seminar was discussed – evaluations were positive, although the turnout was lower than expected. The next seminar will be May 23 on GPS. An exam refresher will be held in September
- The Publications Committee will review the WSLs articles and by-laws to see what changes, if any, need to be changed
- Standards Review Committee reported on their last meeting. A number of committee member maps were reviewed. The map received from the Ethics & Practices Committee was reviewed and a report was sent back. The review process has opened the eyes of all involved and may prompt needed changes to AE-7
- Discussion was held concerning the WSLs website and how it can be improved, including the possibility of using outside professionals to help
- President Casucci led a discussion on the draft for a new continuing education program. Every Chapter should review the draft and get comments back to the President by June. The Strategic Planning Committee has been assigned the task of hammering out the details for the new program

Auditing Committee (Dale Raisleger)

- The 2007 books are all in order

CST Committee (Jim Westerman)

- \$450 ear-marked for CST will be split evenly between all applicants, regardless of the number
- Testing at NWTC was available online, with all but one NWTC student passing - CONGRATS!
- The DOT has been asked to implement the CST Program into their contractor staking. This was discussed in great length with Jerry Zogg from WisDOT. Jerry agreed to further discuss this with

other members of WisDOT. Since the request was only 3 weeks ago, no reply has been received.

Ethics and Practices (Tom Leslie)

- One complaint was reviewed and a report of the findings forwarded to the complainants. They were not happy with the conclusions and may go to the State Ethics Committee

2008 Farm Tech Days (Jim Wallen)

- The Farm Tech people are having a meeting on April 19th that will go over various details, etc. Jim will report at the next meeting
- STUDENTS NEEDED!!! Please tell students to volunteer for the staking of Tent City. This will gain them valuable experience! The staking should be done in either late May or early June, depending on weather
- A sign-up sheet for staking and also for manning the NE Chapter booth were made available for volunteers to sign. Any GPS units that can be used for the staking would be greatly appreciated!
- The booth could use any old instruments, county monuments, old maps, etc for display at the Farm Tech Days. This will be great PR for the Chapter
PLEASE VOLUNTEER!!

Land Records (Pat Ford)

- Mandatory electronic real estate transfer returns will go into effect on July 1, 2009. If you file documents, you may want to check out the system at www.dor.state.wi.us/ust/retn.html
- The title industry wants a flat fee for recording documents, no matter how the amount of pages, thus making it easier to tell customers the cost. The Wisconsin Register of Deeds Association has just started to look into this request
- The comment period for FEMA mapping in Brown County ends on April 30, 2008. If you have data that should be included, it must be to the BC Zoning Department on Monday, April 28th for inclusion in the packet being sent to FEMA

Legislative (Ed Harvey)

- The Legislation is out of session right now – with 2 special sessions yet to go. The process of setting up committees has also started

Students (Jesse Delveaux)

- “Thank You” to all those companies that donate Student Meals – they are always appreciated!
- CST testing held at NWTC was a BIG success

Trig Star (Tom Wood)

- The raffle has been better than anticipated. Your participation has made the Trig Star program nearly self-sufficient. (\$128 was raised this meeting)
- Southwest & West De Pere have agreed to continue participation, with De Pere opting out for this year
- State Trig Star is contemplating a \$1500 scholarship for next year. The requirements would be: taking the test and enrolled in a surveying program. The winner does not have to win the contest, merely take the test

Old Business

- The Northeast Chapter seminar was a HUGE success, with 77 participants. Comments have been very positive. *Perhaps another seminar for next March might be in order?*
- Continuing Education has been signed by the Governor and is ready to be implemented. Many of the details need to be worked out, and will probably be ready in a year or two at the most

New Business

- It was decided that the NE Chapter Summer General Meeting should be held as usual. That would be a good time to go over any last minute details before the WSLs Summer meeting
- A short discussion was held on the latest news from the Standards Review Committee. A request was made by Lisa Van Horn for all attending members to send in one of their maps for a review by the committee. It may be very eye opening to see how your maps adhere to AE-7 requirements. This would be for educational purposes only. If any map is deemed to be negligent, the map may be turned into the Ethics & Practices Committee for their review as well. Lisa will also bring in a few of her own maps for review
- President John Casucci asked a question: *Do any surveyors prepare deeds for their clients?* Most responded with “No” - which agrees with the majority of surveyors around the state
- President Casucci also noted that some delineators in the state are using hand-held GPS units and coordinates from GIS maps to do their jobs. THIS IS A PROBLEM. *Do we have this up here as well?*
- Joe Lett reported that Michigan Tech’s Bachelor of Science program continues to see steady growth with 55 students now enrolled. Dialog has been established between MTU and Wisconsin defining transfer criteria. Funding will be available to help defray out of state tuition

- The MTU Surveying Engineering program is proposing a Masters Degree program called “Integrated Geospatial Technologies”. The program proposes to combine the base sciences of geodesy, photogrammetry, cartography, surveying, and topographic and thematic mapping along with new technological developments found in optics, electronics, robotics and computing. It’s in the early stages so more news will follow
- MTU Student Chapter recently competed in the 2008 NSPS Surveying Student Team Competition held in Spokane, Washington. They raised \$6000 to help pay their way to the competition. The team took 5th out of 9 teams, with a 1st place awarded in the field portion of the competition. CONGRATS!!
- The Student Chapter is also planning another GLO Retracement Seminar in September 2008 in Houghton area. Surveyors from the U.S. Forest Service and the Michigan DNR will lead the group to an original William Burt section corner. A definite date and fee schedule to follow with all proceeds benefiting the Student Chapter

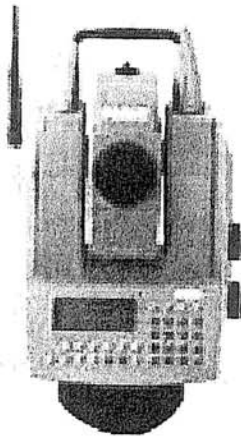

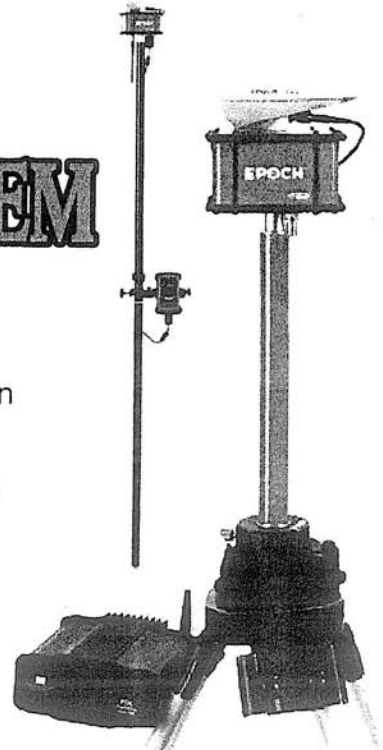

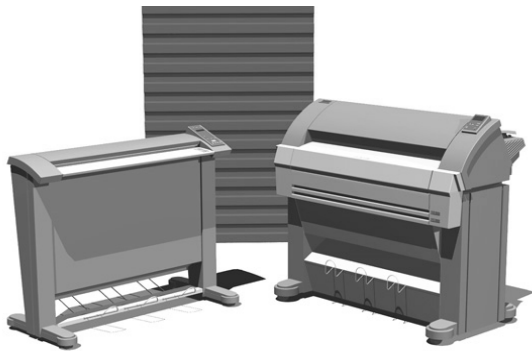
