





Bacon-Davis Act

Hello Terry,

I apologize that we have responded sooner to your request for information in your June 20 email message to John Matonich.

The reasons that NSPS is opposed to the most recent ruling by the Department of Labor regarding the Davis-Bacon Act are primarily that the process for making that ruling was not open, and that by expanding the types of activities conducted by survey crew members on federally funded projects to be within the "covered" categories of the Act, DoL has gone far beyond the original intent of the Act and misclassified the individuals conducting those activities as "laborers and mechanics". The original interpretation (reiterated in the 1960s by the then Secretary of Labor, and again in 2004 in a letter from DoL to ACSM) was that "only" those survey crew members whose primary duties were those such as "clearing brush and sharpening stakes" were to be "covered" by the Act the same as were "laborers and mechanics". It is very rare, if not non-existent, that any of today's survey crew members are performing "only" or even "primarily" those activities.

NSPS was never consulted and no public notice for comments/input was issued by DoL during the entire 18-month period in which it was responding to a request from the Operating Engineers union to expand Davis-Bacon to include more activities of surveyors to be within the categories "covered" by the Act.

By including more activities of survey crew members in the "laborers and mechanics" category, DoL is degrading the professional nature and responsibilities associated with the work of surveyors and their survey crews.

The position taken by DoL that its recent ruling is necessary because survey crew members are underpaid is belied by the findings of their Bureau of Labor Statistics and other national studies regarding salaries.

Given all of this, the recent ruling by DoL unnecessarily places significant and needless compliance and wagerate reporting requirements on private companies, and on the agencies that administer projects.

The overall issue of whether or not the Davis-Bacon Act in general is a good or bad thing is not really for us to decide. Our responsibility is to protect our members and the surveying profession from needless bureaucracy and degradation.

I hope this explanation provides what you need. Please contact me if you have further questions, or simply would like to discuss the issue.

 Representative Pat Strochota will be submitting two amendments to the Governor's budget related to the Wisconsin Land Information Program (WLIP). The first relates to counties that have completed the redaction process, and the second relates to the base budget and education funding to the counties. While the exact language will not be known until the amendment is made, but the intent for the counties that have completed the redaction process will retain the \$5 until January 2015, then it would be submitted to the State to be used for grants given back out to the counties. The second is in support of \$100,000 base budget grants, \$1000 education grants, and discourage lapses to the general fund

WSLS hopes the marketing firm can help organize all the various chapter activities into one area on the WSLS website, thus giving members better access to all that's happening within the State and Chapters
- TPPs there's talk of possibly removing utilities from TPPs. It's agreed that there's much confusion concerning TPPs and what can and can't be done on them. Utility locates are suffering – bad, inaccurate markings or none at all, and not showing up in a timely manner
- Tom L will send out a "Save the Date" email reminder for the upcoming Summer Meeting at Branch River Golf & Tennis Club in Manitowoc. He will also send out PRIZE gathering emails a month or so before the meeting
- World Surveyor's Day will the Chapter do anything for this? The official date is the "Friday after the third Sunday in March"
- WISCORS user fee was discussed nothing has been brought forward, just talk right now
- Gene Hojan, professional member (retired), was recommended to become a "Lifetime Member" of the Chapter. The Board approved the nomination pending a check of his membership status the last few years

- Dan Hoel, a past Chapter member and great supporter
 of the Chapter and its efforts, was recommended to
 receive an "Honorary Life Member". The Board
 approved the nomination pending a quick check of
 the Chapter By-Laws to see if this topic has been
 addressed. Tom L will report at the next Board
 meeting. Tom L will draft up letters to send to the
 two new Life Members, and Tony L will revise and
 approve, then sign and mail them out
- Scott D provided website information to the group.
 He talked about the website specifics: how many hits, visits, referrals, pages viewed, top search topics, etc.
- Should the Chapter ask our meeting venues to advertise on our website? The website information noted above would be a great tool to help demonstrate just how many people are visiting our website – Jeff D has expressed interest in helping
- NSPS reported that there's a BIG push for countrywide parcel mapping. NSPS has added lots of \$\$ to the Government Affairs & Legislative Committees
- An NSPS online library is in the works. The hope is to get all the States information in one place
- NSPS is looking to offer health insurance to its members – more research is needed
- Join the Government Affairs email list by contacting NSPS and asking to be on the list. It is not automatic with your annual membership dues
- The US Department of Labor has recently ruled that Survey Crews are subject to construction prevailing wage law (Davis-Bacon Act). The ruling expands the department's mandated "prevailing rate" of wages on federally-funded contracts for construction to surveying technicians engaged in "laying off distances and angles to locate construction lines and other layout measurements. This includes the setting of stakes, the determination of grades and levels, and other work which is performed as an aid to the crafts which are engaged in the actual physical construction of projects," and classifies such workers as "laborers or mechanics"
- Les & Lisa Van Horn thanked the Chapter for their help during their recent recoveries. They are donating money back to the Chapter to use as it sees fit – Thank you!



Land Records (Ryan Duckart)

- Outagamie County's Interactive Mapping site has gone mobile. Customers can access property and tax information from their mobile device. Questions and/or comments can be directed to GIS staff at gismail@outagamie.org
- Recently, there has been a lot of information out there about the Governor's budget, and the impact to the WLIP (Wisconsin Land Information Program). The Governor's budget proposes that an existing \$5 social security number redaction fee be sent to

- the Department of Administration (DOA) to develop a statewide parcel map. The Governor's budget also tasks the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) with the development of an updated statewide land cover map. Funding for the land cover project does not come from the WLIP
- Recently, the DOA submitted a proposal to the State Joint Finance Committee (JFC) to lapse \$1 million from the WLIP into the State General Fund. The lapse is not entirely a surprise because this has happened every year recently, totaling over \$6 million thus far. Wisconsin in the past has been a national leader in geospatial technology and land records data, but has been falling behind due to an entire host of issues. The lapses have only been part of the equation. Geospatial data is crucial for economic growth, environmental protection, wireless 911 and many other uses
- There is a JFC meeting scheduled for tonight, April 18th in St. Croix County which will cover the topics of a \$5 fee for WLIP for a statewide digital parcel mapping that locals provide, updates to the land cover map, and the elimination of lapses to the WLIP. They will also discuss Base Budget Grants, an education grant, and the accountability at state and local levels of all WLIP funds and their intended uses

<u>Legislative</u> (Ed Harvey)

Pages 12 & 13 of the Chapter's April newsletter are a copy of the proposed "Notice of property line change" Bill that has been introduced in 2013. It basically states that 30 days notice is needed before a property line can change be recorded, and said notice must be in writing
