





## Consent Agenda:

A motion was made by Badtke to approve the written reports on the Consent Agenda including the Reports of the following committees: Education/CST, Geospatial, Outreach, WIDOT Liaison, Recordation Ad-Hoc, and the reports from: Central Chapter, Northwest Chapter, Society of Southeastern WI Land Surveyors Chapter, and Western Chapter. The motion was seconded by Bednar and carried.

## Additions to Agenda:

The following topics were added under New Business: Exploration into a cadaster system, Plat Review Unit/State Surveyor, and Education Path to Licensure.

## Reading of the Minutes:

A motion was made by Sehloff to approve the minutes of the March Board meeting. The motion was seconded by Badtke and carried.

## President's Address:

President Duckart reported on his trip to DC for NSPS board and day on the hill. He has been very busy as Trig Star coordinator. He attended some committee meetings and will follow up. PLSS forum is coming up.

## Report of the Treasurer:

A motion was made by Harley to approve the treasurer's report. The motion was seconded by Sehloff and carried.

## Report of the Executive Director:

Welch and Hauer-Mossman gave a brief summary of TWG activities.

## Reports of Standing Committees:

### Annual Institute:

Beilfuss report was read by Duckart. 2025 Institute was very successful.

### Audit Committee:

They will be auditing the Foundation accounts.

### Communication Committee:

Harley reported on committee activities. She encouraged each Chapter to "clean up" their section of the website. The committee is also active with social media.

## WISCONSIN PROFESSIONAL SURVEYOR

**Ethics and Standards Committee:**

**Government Affairs Committee:**

Welch reported on his efforts on Digger's Hotline reforms, the continuing efforts on AE6, and all the proposals wrapped up in a potential affordable housing bill package. He reported that Professional Surveyors are now included in the Daniel's Law trailer bill as exempted parties – meaning they can access the redacted names. Duckart gave a full report on the results of the Trig Star program this year.

**Workforce Development Committee:**

Sehloff reported on the committee efforts and potential future seminars.

**Young Surveyors Network:** Christopherson reported there is an uptick in new surveyors taking the test and getting licensed. He also reported on potential expenses for a fall NSPS board/Young Surveyor meeting. There will be a summer meeting in the Dells.

**Special Committees:****Ad-Hoc Committee on Investments:**

Ballast reported the committee will meet soon.

**NSPS Director Report:**

Kleinmann reported on national testing changes NCEES is considering that could affect Wisconsin. Questions remain as to whether PLSS is in the test, and whether there will be a "surveyor" test that is not a full test. A motion was made by Kleinmann to have WSLS send a formal letter to the Survey Section at DSPS to open up a dialogue on this topic. The motion

was seconded by Sehloff and carried.

**Reports of At-Large Directors:**

**Foundation Report:**

## 2025 NSPS Spring Business Meeting and Student Competition Report

*Editor's note: The NSPS Meeting took place March 17-21, 2025*



This past week I attended the NSPS Spring Business Meeting as a member of both the WSLs Northeast Chapter (where I serve as the NE Chapter's Representative to the state's YSN as well as other committees), and as a member of the WSLs where I recently joined the Education & CST Committee, and serve as the Vice President of the YSN of WSLs

I departed for Washington D.C. Monday morning and arrived midday where we traveled North to Silver Spring and checked in to our hotel (shared between myself and Devin Bailey). That evening I attended a briefing for both Day on the Hill (DOTH) and the 2025 Student Competition. The next morning I attended DOTH with Dick Kleinmann (WSLs Director), Ryan Duckart (WSLs President), Bob Welch and Stamena (both from The Welch Group). We met with staffers of 4 U.S. Representatives from Wisconsin (Fitzgerald, Grothman, Weid,

and Pocan) and a staffer for Senator Tammy Baldwin. We dropped off a copy of our material with Senator Ron Johnson's office in preparation of our virtual meeting the following week.

During our meetings with Members of Congress we discussed the importance of maintaining professional licensure for Land Surveyors nationwide (as well as Civil Engineers and Architects), the TAP Program (which assists veterans transition into civilian land surveying), and monument replacement legislation (in times of natural disasters). We did not get a full commitment from any of the members we met with (difficult in just meeting with their staffers, and the tumultuous times in which they're in), but all meetings went really well and we fielded great questions from them; it was a great team effort from all 5 of us within the Wisconsin Delegation meetings. After our meetings, we briefly stopped by the Student Competition on the National Mall to visit and witness goings-on.

The following day I participated in the last day of the Student Competition. I was assigned to the "Traverse" activity (one of 5 field exercises the students complete) which is commonly known as the "chain and compass activity" led by Les and Lisa Van Horn. We were situated between the Washington Monument and the WWII Memorial / Reflecting Pool Area. Being able to observe and assist these students in using this vintage equipment in such a location was an irreplaceable experience. The evenings activities centered around a party at Dave & Busters that was put on by some of YSN Leadership (Nolan and Denver). This was an awesome networking opportunity where I met many other young surveyors from across the country; learning about different laws,

how ordinances work in their states, divergent practices / state requirements, etc.

Thursday we attended “NGS Day”, which was a 3-4 hour seminar on the 2022 Datum Reference Frames and how their rollout was currently looking, and what we could anticipate in the future. There were speakers from NOAA (including NGS officials and a NOAA Corps pilot), as well as NSPS and YSN members. This was followed by the award ceremony which was also very gratifying in seeing these teams that tried so hard get rewarded for their efforts. After this there was a Young Surveyors Network meeting where we met to discuss future events, as well as swear in new officers. This, much like the Dave & Buster’s event, was an excellent networking opportunity to continuing to meet young surveyors.

On Friday I briefly attended the NSPS Board of Director’s Meeting and witnessed goings-on within the leadership of NSPS. This was awesome to see how things are done at the national-level. After that, the YSN was invited to attend an in-depth tour of NOAA by some leadership personnel. We were given a very cool presentation on their “projection sphere” and learned about MANY different things.

After that we made our way down South towards Washington D.C. where we would spend our last night at the Hilton Garden Inn; just a 2000’ walk from the White House where I used the opportunity to see things I would not otherwise be able to see. I first went to the National Archives where I saw the Constitution, Declaration of Independence and the Bill of Rights. It was also incredible to see the paintings on the ceilings depicting the different events; pictures don’t do full justice. After this I was able to secure tickets to visit the U.S. Holocaust Memorial Museum. This was by-far one of the most moving experiences of my life and I cannot wait to get back there to see all the things I missed in my 2-hour stay. At night I walked the reflecting pool and stopped by the Lincoln Memorial; listening to / watching the “I Have a Dream” speech and “The Gettysburg Address” in spoken form respectively. I finished the night by visiting the Vietnam Memorial where I got night-time pictures. All incredibly moving.

On Saturday I revisited the Vietnam Memorial, which was a much, much more stirring experience in the daytime, where I was able to fully feel what it means and represents. After spending some time here, I moved along



Sehloff seconded the motion. The motion carried.

## Additions to Agenda:

The following items were added to the agenda: Foundation Report as new item number 11, moving Workforce to Standing Committee Section, Bryan

Meyer's paper on AE 6, and PLSS Forum request for funding.

## Reading of the Minutes:

Sehloff moved to approve the minutes of the January Board meeting. Badtke seconded the motion. The motion carried.

## President's Address:

Duckart reported that he attended Illinois, Michigan, Minnesota, and Iowa Society meetings. He stated that he has been very busy but is excited about his role. He appointed committee chairs and is reviewing the committee charges. He will be attending the NSPS meeting in Washington, D.C., next week.

## Report of the Treasurer:

DeMuth moved to approve the Treasurer's report, Christopherson seconded. The motion carried.

## Report of the Executive Director:

Welch gave a summary of TWG activities.

## Reports of Standing Committees:

### Audit Committee:

No Report.

### Communication Committee:

Harley reported on committee activities, noting that the committee has been very active in increasing

communications on the website and social media.

**Education/CST Committee:**

Herrild reported that Northeast Wisconsin Technical College (NWTC) is short of faculty and considering dropping Land Surveying classes. He moved that WSLs draft a letter to the NWTC President in support of continuing those classes. DeMuth seconded the motion. The motion carried.

**Government Affairs Committee:**

Welch reported on his efforts regarding Digger's Hotline reforms, the continuing efforts on AE6, and the fact that the fee increase issue will be coming back up. Ballast moved that WSLs negotiate from the position that we would support increased recording and transfer fees if the online access search and convenience fees are eliminated. Sehloff seconded the motion. The motion carried.

**Nominating Committee:**

Sehloff reported that discussions are ongoing for new positions. He brought up the current policy that you are eligible to run again after serving your term. They have several potential firms to interview. DeMuth moved to allow the Committee to make the investment decisions. Heberlein seconded the motion. The motion carried.

**Madison Chapter:**

Smith reported on the Chapter activities. The County surveyor did a presentation on the Judicial Privacy Act. The Patrick Marsh fund has received over \$4,000.

**Northeast Chapter:**

Jensen reported on the Chapter activities. They have a committee working on the 2026 summer meeting. They will be holding a seminar on May 9th and have lots of new active members.

**Northern Lakes Chapter:**

Arendt reported on the Chapter activities. They are experiencing a shortage of witness posts in their area and have the summer meeting pretty well planned. Arendt asked if there was a way to coordinate seminars between Chapters. The Board suggested putting it on the WSLs Calendar early.

**Western Chapter:**

Harley reported on the Chapter activities and noted that they discussed the changing of coordinate systems.

**Unfinished Business:**
